Facts about NCLB Funding:

- The federal Department of Education allocates a certain amount of NCLB money for every child who attends a private school.
- This money is paid to the public school district in which the private school resides until the private school requests it from its local school district.
- NCLB has five titles that fund different educational initiatives. Title II is the initiative that supports teacher and administrative training.
- The training has to be provided by an approved qualified provider of training. Training has to be more than one day long.
- Graduate school programs do qualify for NCLB funding.
- The local school district determines the qualified providers for training.
- Each public school district determines its own procedures and timelines for accessing the money.

How to Access NCLB Funding:

- Contact the local public school district in which your school resides.
- Speak with the Government Funding Director or whoever administers the NCLB funding.
- Request information regarding the procedures to receive your school's portion of the NCLB federal funding.
